## **Major Duties/Responsibilities:**

- development, management and assessment of regulatory policies, procedures, standards and guidelines, in accordance with current research and College priorities, and supported by thorough analysis
  - performing comprehensive assessments of proposed policies, standards and guidelines, identifying potential impacts
- evaluation of existing policies and programs to ensure currency, relevance, and effectiveness in meeting regulatory objectives
- analysis of alternative means of meeting regulatory objectives, including the review of initiatives of other jurisdictions, and evaluating the various implications of these options
- production of high-quality briefing materials, including research reports, legislative documentation, discussion papers, information items, options papers and decision papers for Council and committees

- provision of strategic support to the Registrar and Deputy Registrar, by keeping abreast of current regulatory, health system and other related issues, identifying and providing analysis on regulatory relevance
- assistance in integrating and disseminating information to Council, committees and stakeholders as appropriate
- liaising with stakeholders including government, other regulatory bodies, professional associations, mental health associations, community and other public stakeholders
  - soliciting, analyzing and integrating input from stakeholders to inform development and evaluation of standards, policies and guidelines
- contributing to interdepartmental initiatives to ensure alignment across regulatory functions
- collection and analysis of internal data related to regulatory functions and preparation of required reports
  - aligning with required KPIs and recommending other relevant performance indicators

**Knowledge:**

- in-depth knowledge of the development, analysis, revision and implementation of policies, procedures, standards and guidelines
- strong ability to synthesize multiple ideas and complex information into a coherent summary, as in reports and briefing notes to provide project support in the development and evaluation of strategic regulatory policies, standards and guidelines
- superior verbal and written communication skills, with the ability to deliver presentations with tact, clarity and accuracy to widely varied audiences
- aptitude for developing and maintaining collaborative relations and for functioning effectively on inter-departmental as well external initiatives
- familiarity with legislation governing regulatory colleges
- knowledge of performance management and evaluation frameworks and basic theories, principles and methods of analysis
- ability to act as a resource person for other staff in their research, communication, implementation, coordination and evaluation activities;
- knowledge of project methodologies, tools and techniques to provide support in a complex project driven environment
- excellent computer skills (office administration, project management, research and evaluation technologies) to access the Internet as a research tool and to prepare materials using various software programs

**Requirements:**

- 3-5 years of relevant experience in health policy, legal, legislative, or public affairs; advanced training and/or education also counts toward experience
- Bachelor's degree in politics, policy, public health, health, communications, or a related field; advanced degree preferred
